KYCPG programs include:

Sponsoring the 1-800-GAMBLER telephone helpline operated by trained crisis line staff at River Valley Behavioral Health in Owensboro, KY – a free, confidential service available 24-hours a day/7-days a week.

Continuing training co-sponsored by the state Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, with a goal to have at least one certified compulsive gambler counselor in each of the state's comprehensive care centers.

Working with Gamblers' Anonymous to increase the self-help opportunities for Kentuckians who realize they need assistance in dealing with their addiction.

Striving to further professional education and public awareness on the issue through seminars, meetings, media releases and outreach efforts such as *Responsible Gaming Education Week*.

Increasing awareness among the helping communities by conducting programs at the state School on Alcohol and Other Drug Studies, the Family Resource and Youth Service Centers Conference, and more.

Implementing, with the Kentucky Lottery, *Choices: There Is Always a Right One!*, for in-school awareness.

Informing legislators of the need for identification and treatment of compulsive gambling when considering gambling-related legislation and working for passage of a *GAP – Gamblers Assistance Program*.

Creating awareness brochures, distributing informational booklets and producing a newsletter all for use either in advising clients or informing counselors and the gaming industry about compulsive gambling issues.

*These efforts are part of the KYCPG effort to attain its goals by assisting compulsive and problem gamblers seeking help, expanding awareness of problem gambling, and increasing compulsive gambling counseling availability. The KYCPG, a 501(c)(3) organization, is prohibited from taking a position for or against gambling. **But, when it's no longer a game – there is help!** Again, thank you for your membership and support.*
